## **Abstract**

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The Topicality of "Bildnachricht" in the German Daily Tempo (1928–1933)

The Summer School presents an opportunity for me to consider an aesthetic and epistemological concept central to my dissertation, Aktualität, in connection to a specific small form, the "Bildnachricht." The first number of the illustrated Ullstein tabloid *Tempo* (1928-1933) boasted its images were not simply "illustration[s]" but "Nachricht[en]" conveyed in the "vivid language of images." By this technique, *Tempo* claimed to enhance feelings of Aktualität that would generate a mood of productive pressure in its consumers. In 1933, media phenomenologist Hans Traub defined Nachricht as a "Mitteilung zur Entscheidung" and so linked it to the horizon of Aktualität. Drawing on a chapter in progress, I would propose that carefully unpacking these terms – Aktualität, Nachricht, and Bildnachricht – helps us think more clearly about political and aesthetic stakes embedded in *Tempo's* method to render visible the contemporary. Doing so may also make it possible to evaluate other small forms by the perspectives these categories entail.
